The state revenue restricted to the purposes specified in the amendment is estimated to be \$648 million in Fisca Year 2015-16 and grows to \$1.268 billion by the twentieth year. Whethe this results in any additional state expenditures depends upon future legislative actions and cannot be determined. Similarly, the impact on local government revenues, if any, cannot be determined. No additional local government costs are expected.

Voter's Bill of Rights

Each registered voter in this state has the right to:

- 1. Vote and have his or her vote accurately counted.
- 2. Cast a vote if he or she is in line at the official closing of the polls in that county,
- 3. Ask for and receive assistance in voting.
- 4. Receive up to two replacement ballots if he or she makes a mistake prior to the ballot being cast.
 - 5. An explanation of his or her registration or identity is in question.
- 6. If his or her registration or identity is in question, cast a provisional ballot.
- 7. Written instructions to use when voting, and, upon request, oral instruction in voting from elections officers.
 - 8. Vote free from coercion or intimidation by elections officers or any other person.
- 9. Vote on a voting system that is in working condition and that will allow votes to be accurately cast.

voter's Responsibilities

- Each registered voter in this state should:

 1. Familiarize himself or herself with the candidates and issues.

 2. Maintain with the office of the supervisor of elections a current address.

 3. Know the location of his or her polling place and its hours of operation.

 4. Bring proper identification to the polling station.

 5. Familiarize himself or herself with the operation of the voting equipment in his or her precinct.

 - Treat precinct workers with courtesy. Respect the privacy of other voters.

- Report any problems or violations of election laws to the supervisor of elections. Ask questions, if needed. Make sure that his or her completed ballot is correct before leaving the polling station.

NOTE TO VOTER: Failure to perform any of these responsibilities does not prohibit a voter from voting.

At the polls, you will be asked to provide a valid picture identification with signature. The following photo ids will be accepted:

Florida driver's license • Florida identification card issued by the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles United States passport • Debit or credit card • Military identification • Student identification Retirement center identification • Neighborhood association identification • Public assistance identification

If your photo identification does not contain your signature, you will be asked to provide an additional identification that includes a signature.
